EASTER SUNDAY (B) 31st March 2024

Introduction

- Greet the people and name the Sunday of the Year (see above)
- Acknowledge visitors and welcome them.
- Remind everyone that there will be refreshments????
- Announce the theme of the liturgy (see next)

Theme – THE JOY OF THE RESURRECTION

leader:

The joy of the resurrection, proclaimed and celebrated during the Easter Vigil, overflows into the Mass of Easter day. The Easter candle is alight in the sanctuary, alleluias are sung. We continue the celebration of the resurrection. It is appropriate for the faithful to renew their baptismal promises at Mass on Easter day. This renewal replaces the profession of faith and is accompanied by the sprinkling of the people with water from the baptismal font. A song having a baptismal character is sung. The Easter sequence and Alleluia are sung before the gospel reading. We gather to celebrate God's victory, in Christ, over the power and attraction of death. The gospel for Easter Day is the foundation story about how would-be disciples of Jesus came to a transformed faith and new life. This is the kind of community of hope, into which the baptised have been incorporated at Easter. Now they are themselves committed, to realise that community through their own practice.

Life's own Champion, slain, yet lives to reign. Tell us, Mary; say what you did see upon the way. The tomb the Living did enclose; I saw Christ's glory as he rose! The angels there attesting; shroud with grave-clothes resting. Christ, my hope, has risen; he goes before you into Galilee. That Christ is truly risen from the dead we know. Victorious king, your mercy show.

Gospel Acclamation:

Introduction to the gospel reading: (John 20: 1-9)

leader: the resurrection of Jesus

Homily Notes (presider)

- The primary visible sign of the resurrection of Jesus in the early church communities was the assembly of those who continued to listen for GOD's WORD of promise in Jesus and who, "ate and drank with him"(Ac. 10:41) in a Eucharistic communion.
- Our hearing the WORD of GOD through the witnesses to the resurrection of Jesus is a moment of subversion and ambiguity for us. Like the disciples after their discussion with the strange rabbi on the road to Emmaus, we hold together our old failed, largely unexamined world, along with a new hopeful world of promise, voiced in the announcement of the "apostle to the apostles" - Mary of Magdala.
- The memory of the Easter Triduum, of Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection, subverts our human concepts of managed delivery systems for health and well-being. We can even dare to think of a future world where there will be life for everyone that is the powerful imagery of GOD's WORD and Action. In the moment of worship we are on the threshold of God's promised new world when GOD's astonishing newness can be given.
- Surprisingly it is Mary of Magdala who is the "apostle to the apostles". She speaks a hope beyond the painful data of death; that out of the shatterings of collapse, GOD works newness. The Easter liturgy celebrates GOD's creation of what does not exist and what we cannot conceive through our own efforts: a genuine communion based on the ancient covenant promises.
- The essence of that communion, is a proper regard for the dignity of each person; regardless of age, gender, class or religion. Because GOD reigns over death, networks of justice and freedom can function and

we can live fully! The Lent of our old world presses us in anguish. The Easter of GOD's new covenant, seems unlikely – and it always is unlikely – until it is given!

RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL PROMISES

leader: Friends in Christ, through the Paschal mystery we have been buried with Christ in baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life. Now that we have completed our Lenten observance, let us renew the promises we made in baptism when we renounced Satan and all the works of evil, and promised to serve GOD faithfully in the holy Catholic Church. And so:

RENUNCIATION OF SIN

presider: Do you reject sin, so as to live in the freedom of GOD's people?

Do you reject the glamour of evil, and refuse to be mastered by sin?

Do you reject Satan, father of sin and prince of darkness?

Do you believe in GOD, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and Earth?

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our LORD, who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified, died, and was buried, rose from the dead, and is now seated at the right hand of the Father?

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

SPRINKLING WITH BLESSED WATER

presider: The Lord be with you. all: **And also with you.**

presider: Lift up your hearts.

all: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

presider: It is truly right and just,

May GOD bless us so that our lives may be holy and we will be united with Christ, until we gather again:
