Introduction to the gospel reading: (John 10:11-18)

leader: The fourth gospel presents a sharp contrast between Jesus and all the other alternatives. All other would-be leaders are false and damaged

people, while Jesus is the true leader. The gospel writer has Jesus attacking all kinds of corrupt leaders when he says: "I am the good shepherd . . ."

Homily Notes (presider)

- The core of our faith is in a short passage only four verses from the Gospel of John that is this Sunday's reading. Faith is first and foremost, a response to a call from the Lord. We are his sheep who hear his voice. And that voice is not some generalised invitation, a "Hey, people, come with me."
- The Lord addresses each of us individually, inviting us one by one to follow him. That is what he means when he says he knows his sheep. Sheep may all look alike to the unpractised uncaring eye; however, the shepherd can tell them apart. The two billion or so, Christians in the world also look generally alike. There are of course, variations of gender, build or race, but to some hypothetical visitor from outer space who did not love us, we would probably seem pretty much the same.
- But Jesus is not some unloving visitor from outer space. He loves us. So, he calls and cares for us one by one. He knows who I am and calls me by name. What he calls me to is eternal life. For whatever reasons of his own, in his love, Christ has called me to be one who, "shall never perish." Or, more accurately – since that infinite love is given to all people – he calls me to know that gift and the love that gives it.
- I have seen enough corpses of Christians (and expect to be one myself some day) to know that whatever this promise of eternal, imperishable life means, it does not mean an escape from death. Christ died in order to rise. I too, must die in order to fully experience the eternal life to which he calls me.
- Jesus gives us reason to be hopeful in the face of death. "No one shall snatch them our of my hand... there is no snatching out of the Father's hand." Jesus affirms his identity with the Father in the context of a guarantee. Death shall certainly take us, but it can never snatch us away from the loving care of God, the life-giving love of God. So, we will live as long as that love lives – eternally.
- What then of my day-to-day life? Should I just drift along. Every so
 often (an hour each Sunday, for example) remembering that I have
 been promised eternal life, but otherwise being indistinguishable from
 my neighbours who do not know that promise? If I do so, it is a sign
 that I probably do not really believe what the Lord says. It is, after all,
 hard for anyone after adolescence to really believe that he or she is
 going to live forever. I mouth the Creed saying I believe in "life
 everlasting'. But that declaration does not shape my life.
- A Christian is not basically someone who does nice things. A Christian is someone who has been chosen to know God's promise of eternal life. Knowing it, really knowing it in the depths of my being, means that I

will live a particular sort of life. I will not fear the tongues or opinions or other weapons of the world, because I know that they are nothing compared to the eternity I am live.

- I can take the risk of loving other people, sacrificing my time, talents and treasure in their service because I know I have all eternity. I do good not because that is what makes me a Christian, but because what makes me a Christian – the promise of eternal life – frees me to do good.
- It is still Easter time, it is still the season of the Resurrection. It is still the season to remember that my life is not a mater of merely day-today, but of eternity.
