2nd Sunday of Easter (b) 7th April 2024 **Life in the Spirit – II**

Introduction

leader: Greet the people and name the Sunday of the Year (see above)

Acknowledge visitors and welcome them.

Remind everyone about refreshments at the end of Mass????

Announce the theme of the liturgy (see next)

Theme – Living in the spirit of Jesus – multiplying 'Shalom' (Peace)

leader: The light of the Easter Candle symbolises the risen Christ

lighting our autumn darkness.

The light is small. It images Christ's resurrection

at the beginning of the meantime.

Easter is the seed-time of God's reigning.

The reigning of God is planted in a tomb.

In the meantime, realities change.

In the darkness seeds are nurtured and roots grow in the soil.

In faith's darkness we sense, rather than see, God's newness:

Greeting

Opening Prayer

leader: (Kia inoi tatou/Let us pray:...) God of Life, source of all faith,

through the waters of baptism You have raised us up in Jesus and given us life that endures. Day by day refine our faith,

that we who have not seen the Christ may truly confess him as our Lord and God

and share the blessedness of those who believe.

Grant this through Jesus Christ:

all: Amen.

Introduction to the first reading: (Acts 4: 32 - 35)

leader: The believers in the resurrection of Jesus, share their possessions.

Introduction to the second reading: (1 John 5: 1-6)

leader: Faith overcomes the world – testimony concerning the Son of God.

Gospel Acclamation:

all: Alleluia! Alleluia!

You believe in me, Thomas, because you have seen me; Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe. Alleluia!

Introduction to the gospel reading: (John 20: 19 – 31)

leader: Jesus appears to the disciples – then Jesus addresses Thomas

Homily Notes (presider)

- In today's introduction to the Eucharist, (....N?..) mentioned Easter is the seed-time of God's reigning; that the reigning of God is planted in a tomb!
- In the mean-time, realities change. In the darkness seeds are nurtured and roots grow in the soil. In faith's darkness, we sense, rather than see, God's newness.

 In this mean-time, growth in our faith is possible. Those who have not shared in seeing, still walk in the company of the Risen Christ. Our seedling faith in God's reigning, is refined of excessive growth; much as a plant's growth is refined by winter's chill, darkness and fertilising rains.

- The Easter season is a time for a transformed consciousness. The victory over death of the risen Christ offers Jesus' disciples a profoundly different perception of world, neighbour and themselves and an authorisation to live differently in that world.
- The good news on the threshold between the old shape of reality and the new reality that is to come into being, must be hosted with awe, respect and patience. It is a precious moment when the worldtransforming, promise-keeping, justice-demanding God makes serious change in our lives possible.

leader: The Mass has ended, go in peace to love and serve the Lord:

all: Thanks be to God.
