## my peace I give to you

Today's gospel directs us to celebrate the new presence of Jesus through his Spirit/spirit. Following Jesus; keeping his Word as today's text says, is the proof of our love and true discipleship. One of the major themes of John is that it is only possible to come to God through Jesus. Jesus is the Word; the Son; the revelation of God in our history. There's no other way to God except by, 'keeping his Word'.

The first generation of Christian disciples lived in expectation of the Parousia or the return of Jesus and the ending of the old world. The destruction of holy Jerusalem and the temple (AD.70) confirmed for them the imminent ending of the old world.

The new reality is not only the completion of the restoration in the terms of the prophetic tradition, but something greater and deeper. The description of the beauty and splendour of the Jerusalem repeats point-by-point promises of 'the conqueror' found in the letters to the churches earlier. The promises referred to the whole of the history of salvation that extends back to the origins of humanity. In the Seer's vision of the new Jerusalem (Rev.10), the holy city is the symbol of the reconciliation established between humanity and God. It is a sign of the eternal and definitive covenant of the new people of God.

Jesus is understood by the disciples to be the visible presence of God among humanity – the person who establishes a new covenant with them. Jesus had indicated he would reveal himself to his disciples but not to the world. 'The world' meant those who cannot recognise the Spirit of truth. Judas (not Iscariot) asks why Jesus would limit his self-revelation to his circle of disciples. Jesus' answer is that those who don't act in his Spirit/spirit (i.e. follow his commands) will not be able to understand him.

Disciples of the Risen Jesus, hearers and doers of the new Word of God, voiced in the texts, are between the old world that still seems so powerful, and the new world voiced here.

"Anyone who loves me will keep my Word and my Father will love them and we shall come to them and make a home in them'. Jesus promises to send us his Spirit/spirit. The Spirit would remind us of the Word Jesus spoke.

That Spirit will come as an indwelling 'advocate' or 'lawyer'. Only people in trouble need lawyers. It may not be a case of good people versus bad people; just people struggling to discover truth and to claim justice in a complex world – BF

"Let us ask the Lord for the grace to cultivate and spread God's charity and to become true neighbours to one another. Let us compete in showing the love that, following his encounter with Christ, drove the former persecutor (Paul) to become 'all things to all people' even to the point of martyrdom."
